Target Audience

The Scottish Government have issued a new National Framework for Child Protection Learning and Development. This identifies three groups within the multiagency workforce. These groups are:

- o The general contact workforce
- o The specific contact workforce
- o The intensive contact workforce

This course is targeted at those in the **general contact workforce** which is defined as ***those who, as part of their job are likely to come into contact with children, young people and other family members. These workers will not usually be involved in any in-depth personal work with these children.***

No previous child protection training is required.

Course Outline

The course looks at how agencies work together to protect and assess the needs of children. It considers how everyone in Inverclyde can act to support children and help participants to be clear on what they should do if worried about a child.

This course is funded by Inverclyde Child Protection Committee and there is no charge for those attending.

Core Competencies

The course aims to help practitioners develop the following core competencies:

- o Recognise where there may be concerns about a child's well-being.
- o Know the procedure and take appropriate action.

Course Objectives

It is intended that by the end of this course participants will have:

- o An understanding of their role and responsibilities for child protection and an awareness of the role and responsibilities of others.
- o An awareness of Child Protection systems in Inverclyde.
